

I4WDTA Training for Certification

Uwharrie, North Carolina, USA

1) If you have not already done so, please submit your application. Please see the following link for more information:

2) Remit your application fee of US\$30.00. This can be done via check or PayPal.

3) Be sure to include your one-day curriculum and first-aid certifications with your application.

Applications together with application fees must be submitted by January 15, 2015

4) If your application is approved, you then may attend the "Training for Certification Course and Examinations [TFC]" This involves an intense 4-day course that includes by a 4-hour written and ongoing practical examinations. If you pass, you will then become an I4WDTA Certified Instructor.

Applicants will be notified by January 30, 2015 of acceptance and fees then determined. (The cost estimate will be between USD\$1000.00 - \$1500.00. This includes the course materials, conference facility, training and evaluation. Recommendations for lodging and other meals will be provided. Attendance numbers will determine whether we are able to include lodging and meals. Either way, you will be notified as to what the fee is and what it includes.)

50% Deposit required by February 15, 2015

Final payment must be received before TFC begins in North Carolina.
